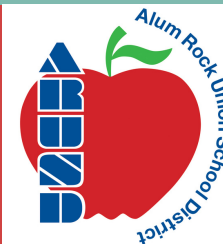

LEARNING OPPORTUNITIES

We have an abundance of exciting learning opportunities for our students! As part of the requirements under AB86 - Expanded Learning Opportunities Grants, LEAs are tasked with implementing a learning recovery program that provides supplemental instruction, support for social and emotional well-being, meals and other integrated support to specified student groups who have faced adverse learning and social-emotional circumstances.

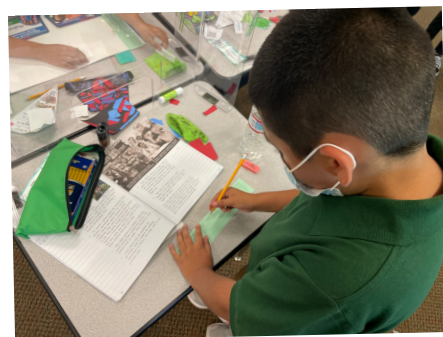
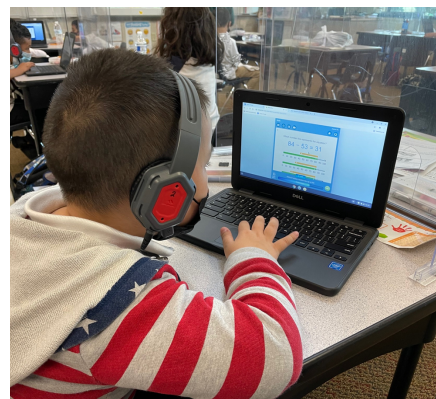
Last Spring, Alum Rock Union Elementary School District developed a plan for providing supplemental support through this new grant funding. The plan includes services to extend instructional learning time through summer programming, learning support services such as tutoring, expansion of school day support, site-based homework/intervention programs, integrated student supports in the form of additional counseling support, additional student meals, student access to technology and high-speed internet, and training for school staff on strategies to address students' social-emotional health and academic needs.

This past summer ARUSD provided a summer learning and enrichment experience for 1,500 students. ARUSD provided 16 high quality academic and enrichment programs across 10 district schools. We were able to continue supporting all children 18 and under with meals throughout the summer. In addition, schools are working on site plans to provide additional homework/intervention services to students that do not already participate in our after school programs.

Our Foster Youth, unhoused students and Migrant students will continue to receive tutoring services through our centralized process in the State and Federal Programs office

We have also increased the number of counselors to provide much needed support to our Elementary Schools this year. Furthermore, staff is currently involved in training on Trauma Informed Practices as well as parent workshops on Social Emotional Strategies and Mental Health awareness. .

We will continue to strengthen and develop these services to support students in the best way possible. Please take advantage of these services and programs. INDEPENDENT STUDY

Our Independent Study Program is up and running. Since day one, the IS classes have been full of students (with @ 350) ready to learn. Much different from distance learning, students have 30 minutes of morning meeting and 30 minutes of synchronous instruction. The remainder of the grade level instructional minutes are filled with assignments in all subject areas, including Physical Education.

In a week the middle school students will transition into online courses on Edgenuity. At the end of October the elementary students will transition as well. Each grade level span will have a parent training and guidelines/expectations review. More to come.
